




TOUR BRITAIN FROM HISTORIC HOUSE HOTELS OF THE NATIONAL TRUST



HARTWELL HOUSE & SPA, BUCKINGHAMSHIRE

One of England's stately homes, just 40 miles north west of London, set in over 90 acres of gardens and parkland, located within the Vale of Aylesbury and on the edge of the Chilterns, an area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.



REASONS TO CHOOSE HARTWELL HOUSE FOR HERITAGE GROUPS:

Stately home located in 90 acres of landscaped parkland and gardens just one hour from central London by train, or by car from Heathrow Airport.

The Grade I listed Jacobean and Georgian house provides all that is best in country house hospitality.

Exile home of King Louis XVIII of France from 1809-1814, who signed his accession to the throne in the Library.

Connections to notable figures, including royalty, nobility and influential political leaders.

The founding of The British Meteorological Society took place in the Library in 1850 (now the Royal Meteorological Society).

Architectural & Artistic Value – A blend of Jacobean North front, and Georgian East and South fronts and Baroque design elements, Rococo ceiling in main hall.

Exceptional interiors with period furniture and paintings.

Significant 18th century landscape gardens designed by Richard Woods, a contemporary of Capability Brown.

Cultural and Educational Opportunities - Access to historic country houses nearby - Waddesdon, Woburn, Blenheim, Stowe Mansion and Landscape Gardens.


Guided tours of the house focussing on royal history, architecture, art and landscape design.

MIDDLETHORPE HALL & SPA, YORK

The only country house hotel in the City of York, set in its own beautiful gardens and landscaped parkland. Just over one hour from Manchester Airport and two hours by express train from London and from Edinburgh.



REASONS TO CHOOSE MIDDLETHORPE HALL FOR HERITAGE GROUPS:

Historic significance – built in 1699, Middlethorpe Hall is a perfectly preserved William and Mary country house.

The house and gardens are now owned by National Trust, ensuring preservation of its heritage.

The house reflects the elegance of early 18th century aristocratic life, giving visitors a glimpse into England's social and cultural history.

Distinguished Architecture – the Hall's red-brick baroque design is a pioneering example of its era, influenced by Sir Christopher Wren, with period features including panelled rooms, grand staircase, antique furnishings and fine art.

Gardens and Parkland – set within 20 acres of landscaped gardens and parkland, that include a series of connecting walled garden 'rooms', manicured lawns and a ha-ha, ornamental lake, historic dovecote and ancient specimen trees.

Cultural and history opportunities.

A peaceful oasis just two miles from York city centre. Tours can easily combine the Hall with visits to York Minster, The Shambles, the city's Viking museum, Fairfax House, Treasurer's House and the National Railway Museum.

Access to North Yorkshire country houses - Beningbrough, Castle Howard, Harewood House, Newby Hall, the Yorkshire Moors and Dales, and Yorkshire's famous Abbeys.




MIDDLETHORPE HALL, PERFECT FOR:
